She is a senior lecturer and research scholar, Yale School of Forestry of Environmental Studies and Yale Divinity School. Jean has worked as a teacher in UK schools and in Papua New Guinea, Indonesia, Russia, and Haiti, and has extensive experience helping refugees and migrant workers to speak English. Mary Evelyn Tucker

Mary Evelyn received her Ph.D. from Columbia University in Japanese Confucianism. She teaches in the joint MA program in religion and ecology. She and husband John Grim have led the American Teilhard Association for many years.

Mary Evelyn is known internationally for her many publications and presentations especially about both the growing environmental crisis and also world religions' attitudes towards them. She worked closely with Thomas Berry from the 1980s until his death in 2009. She and John Grim are the managing trustees of the Thomas Berry Foundation.

In 1995-1998 Mary Evelyn and John organized a series of ten conferences on World Religions and Ecology at the Center for the Study of World Religions at Harvard. They are series editors for the ten volumes distributed by Harvard University Press that resulted from the conferences. They founded and still direct the Forum on Religion and Ecology, the largest multi-religious project of its kind. Mary Evelyn has been involved with the Earth Charter since its inception and contributed, especially, to the Preamble.

Terry Moran

Terry has worked in parish ministry, taught theology at St. John's University, NY, and was Director of Hispanic Ministry of the Diocese of Paterson, NJ, for nine years. His fluency with languages and experiences in many countries make him an ideal leader of Spiritual Directors International's interfaith pilgrimages to Peru, Israel, and Palestine. Terry has written two books, and published articles in *Commonweal, America*, and several other publications.

Jean Newbold, SHCJ

In 2004, while in America, Jean was introduced to the New Cosmology by Alexandra Kovats, CSJP. Jean found that the Universe Story filled her need for 'something' that would give her spirituality much more meaning in the 21st century, particularly at that creative interface where science and religion meet.
