

Anne Marie Dalton, PhD holds a PhD from Catholic University of America and an MA from Fordham University, where she studied with Thomas Berry. Presently, she is Professor Emerita of Religious Studies at Saint Mary's University, Halifax where her teaching and research area included Religion and Ecology, Religion and Science, Religion and International Development. Her PhD thesis examined the theological implications of Berry's work while her MA thesis compared the work of Teilhard de Chardin and Erich Jantsch. Anne Marie has worked on environmental projects in China, Vietnam, and Mongolia and has given many workshops and presentations both in Canada and internationally. The author of two books, *A Theology for the Earth: Thomas Berry and Bernard Lonergan* and *Ecotheology and the Practice of Hope* (co-authored with Henry Simmons), as well as many articles and book chapters, Anne Marie continues to write in the area of religion and ecology as well as to volunteer with local environmental projects in Halifax. As a long time student of the work of Thomas Berry (since 1980!), she continues to be inspired by his work and widespread influence and is particularly interested in the implications of the New Cosmology as a source of contemplation and environmental praxis.
