

John Grim is a Senior Lecturer and Research Scholar teaching in the joint MA program in religion and ecology at Yale University School of Forestry and Environmental Studies and Yale Divinity School. He is co-founder and co-director of the Forum on Religion and Ecology at Yale with his wife, Mary Evelyn Tucker. With Tucker, Grim directed a 10 conference series and book project at Harvard on “World Religions and Ecology.”

Grim is the author of *The Shaman: Patterns of Religious Healing Among the Ojibway Indians* (University of Oklahoma Press, 1983). Grim edited *Indigenous Traditions and Ecology: The Interbeing of Cosmology and Community* (Harvard, 2001). Grim and Tucker are authors of *Ecology and Religion* (Island Press, 2014). Together they edited Thomas Berry’s books and published *Thomas Berry: A Biography* (Columbia University Press, 2019). They have edited the following volumes: *Worldviews and Ecology* (Orbis, 1994); *Religion and Ecology: Can the Climate Change?* (Daedalus 2001); *Thomas Berry: Selected Writings on the Earth Community* (Orbis, 2014); and *Living Cosmology: Christian Responses to Journey of the Universe* (Orbis, 2016), and with Willis Jenkins the *Routledge Handbook on Religion and Ecology* (Routledge, 2016). John is the co-executive producer of the Emmy award winning film, *Journey of the Universe*. He is the President of the American Teilhard Association.
