The departments are looking for a dynamic and innovative colleague who will provide vision and leadership within the environmental arts and humanities as well as within theology and the environment. Attention to the ways that these areas intersect with environmental racism and marginalized communities are of significant interest. Teaching core courses at all levels in Environmental Studies and Religion is expected and may include teaching in a St. Olaf learning community, such as Environmental Conversations. The successful candidate will demonstrate potential for developing scholarship which pursues intersections of religion and the environment that invites participation by undergraduate students in both departments. Post-doctoral experience, prior teaching experience, and a PhD in a relevant field by September 2018 are preferred. Evaluation of completed applications will begin on Sept. 15, 2017.
