This workshop is an invitation to enter musically, poetically and contemplatively into an experience together, interweaving brief texts from Laudato Si'. Its inspiration arises from Chapter One of LS, 'What is Happening to our Common Home' where Pope Francis has written: 'Our goal is not to amass information or to satisfy curiosity, but rather to become painfully aware, to dare to turn to what is happening to the world into our own personal suffering and thus to discover what each of us can do about'.

The workshop will include time for participants to introduce themselves in a breakout dyad and to express their own understanding of the crises facing Earth and humanity at this time. We will weave music and birdsong (from CD, 'Songs of Disappearance'), and sacred listening, lectio divina, to the poem, 'Shadow Line', by the Australian poet Stephen Edgar. After a brief break, we will share a 10-15 minute contemplative compassion practice 'breathing through' both our suffering and love for Earth. There will be time to learn about the Laudato Si' action platform and to sit with the invitations posed to us if we are to respond.
